
- The Community Council resumed formal meetings on 28th April 2020 when a new Community Council was formally appointed
- Due to the number of applications no elections were required
- Members appointed:
- Foulden: Harry Frew, Andy Manley, Elaine Oswald, Anton Whittingham, Nicola Whittingham
- Mordington: Julia Trotter, Tom Trotter, Helen Dempster
- Lamberton: Audrey Sanderson, Will Calder

- Andrew Dempster co-opted
- Ian Price joined as councillor for Lamberton



- The impact of COVID-19 meant that until May 2021 all meetings were conducted on-line using the Zoom application
- The Community Council has had 9 meetings since April 2020
- The Community Council initially delivered by hand a paper based resident survey to ascertain priorities
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions the Open Forum with residents was suspended
- Communication with residents has been via an email update, revamped Twitter and Facebook pages, a new website www.fmlcc.org and a new lnstagram page
- New e-contact arrangements include direct messaging on our <u>twitter</u>, <u>facebook</u>, <u>enquiries.fmlcc@outlook.com</u> email address, and <u>www.fmlcc.org/contact</u> on our website

- Monthly police reports for East Berwickshire Community Councils are sent to the Community Council - this process was disrupted by the COVID 19 pandemic but resumed at the end of October 2020
- Resilience support from Foulden Village Hall Committee with assistance from the Community Council https://www.fmlcc.org/resilience

- Online traffic on digital channels is growing steadily

July 12, 2021

- The new website has been visited 1,866 times since November 2020. This represents 737 unique visitors
- Of the 737 visitors, 312 were referred from the Facebook site, 196 from typing in the web address directly, and 149 from Google
- 67 enquiries were made to the Community Council through the digital channels



- Facebook is our most popular channel 12,633 people have read at least one article – the most popular was 11,000+ people who accessed our post about the road flood in Foulden
- Twitter is getting about 1,500 to 2,000 accounts reading our tweets per month
- Instagram has not made much impression at this stage
